

Wine List & Tasting Notes

Many sommeliers say "Curry does challenge a wine. The main flavours in Thai food are heat, sour, salty and sweet. Each dish is a different combination, and you can get all the flavours in a more complex curry." There are such a varied number of textures and flavours to a Thai meal. Sweetness works with those flavours and stands up to the spicy notes of food. The classic wine matches aren't there, but the staples of Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Gris and Riesling marry well with Thai food."

Champagne, Sparkling and White Wines



Tatachilla Brut NV Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 47

Established in 1903, Tatachilla is a McLaren Vale stalwart, producing wines of distinction sourced from premium vineyards. This sparkling wine is pale straw in colour with a bouquet of delicate floral and fruity notes. Juicy strawberry and apple flavours with a hint of citrus and a nutty finish.



Petaluma Second Blooming Chardonnay Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 47

Second Blooming by Petaluma is a new range of contemporary and minimal preservative wines. Embodied by the beauty of South Australia's native blooms. Vibrant in the glass, displaying all the uplifted nuances of our Limestone Coast vineyards. Generous stone fruit flavours on the palate with weight and texture from wild yeast complexity



Mud House Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc Glass - \$ 12 / Bottle - \$ 52

This is the Sub Region series from Mud House from the end of Rapuara Road. While it has a balanced and quenching finish, the bouquet is full of good grapefruit and passionfruit. Just an additional note - Mud House is part of New Zealand's Sustainable Winegrowing since 2001.



Hardy's The Riddle Sauvignon Blanc Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 47

The Riddle plays on Thomas Hardy's character - just as solving riddles requires wit and careful thinking, his engaging character and touch of daring enabled him to establish a successful wine empire. This South Australian wine has clean tropical notes, with passionfruit, a herbaceous grassy lift and crisp finish.



Tatachilla White Admiral Pinot Grigio Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 48

When chilled, the butterfly transforms to let you know the wine is at a temperature to enjoy. The palate shows delicate rose petal, strawberry and berries. This South Australian wine is quite a delicate, light and refreshing wine that is also lower in Alcohol content at 9% ABV.



Mud House Marlborough Pinot Gris Glass - \$ 12 / Bottle - \$ 52

Another Mud House Sub Region wine series but this time from Grovetown. This Pinot Gris has a great Red Apple, Quince bouquet driving a fruit driven long spicy finish. Growing up in Marlborough instilled Cleighen, the Mud House winemaker with a desire satisfied by vines and wine - it also helps that he enjoys drinking it !!!



Rolf Binder Eden Valley Riesling Glass - \$ 12 / Bottle - \$ 48

Eden Valley is in the Barossa with its Rieslings prized for their vibrancy and longevity producing many of Australia's great Rieslings. The fruit for this Riesling is sourced from four distinct blocks in two Eden Valley vineyards resulting in a delightfully aromatic, with good acidity with vibrant lemon/lime citrus and Fuji apple flavours.

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Red wines do have a hard time with Thai cuisine. Reds can be challenging with fish anyway, which is a common feature of Thai cooking, but add the spiciness and intensity of Thai flavours and the task is greater. The main thing is to avoid tannin, so pinot noir is the obvious choice. Many experts say the “lower level of tannin and high fruit level suit the food styles better, [otherwise] there may be too many things fighting for attention on the palate.”

Red Wines & Rose



St Hallett Barossa Valley Rosé Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 48

The Barossa Valley is the ideal home for producing the fresh red fruit characters that make Grenache a standout variety for delicious Rose. This has a luscious bouquet of fresh strawberries, white stone fruit and summer blossoms with a vibrant abundance of fresh strawberries and cream> It has a clean cut acidity with a savuory hint.



Swanning Around Pinot Noir Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 47

This Juicy Pinot Noir is the ideal red wine when you want something a little lighter. Its versatility This wine has a light & easy, unpretentiousness to it that is so pleasing to the palate with its flavours of ripe raspberry juicy red fruits and very soft tannins..



Petaluma Central Otago Pinot Noir Glass - \$ 12 / Bottle - \$ 52

Sourced from several exceptional sites in Central Otago, the Petaluma vineyards are situated on three terraces, positively influencing the ripening. This Central Otago Pinot Noir is Dark ruby with a purple hue and silky smooth, with a fine and refreshing ripe tannin finish.



Grant Burge Barossa Ink Shiraz Glass - \$ 11 / Bottle - \$ 47

A vibrant, opulent Shiraz designed to make a statement. A rich bouquet of sweet red fruit complement a juicy fruit driven palate. Fine velvety tannins support the round fruit flavours. An ideal sipper, this is an aromatic Shiraz with minimal oak presence.



Petaluma Coonawarra Shiraz Bottle - \$ 55

The grapes are grown in the key regions of Adelaide Hills and Coonawarra. This Shiraz is a medium bodied, bright and vibrant wine with red berry fruit aromas. This flows onto the plate with an abundance of soft silky tannins and a classic earthiness typical of the region. Great with lamb shanks and hearty curries.



Tintara McLaren Vale Cabernet Sauvignon Glass - \$ 12 / Bottle - \$ 52

Tintara wines are a testament to Thomas Hardys quality winemaking. It is an elegant and balanced wine showing impressive Cabernet varietal character. Bright primary red fruits of plum, raspberry and mulberry with and mocha tones. A fine tannin balance and a soft and persistent finish.
